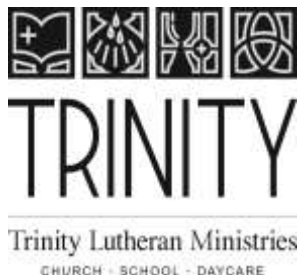

For those who will be communing, Non-alcoholic wine is available and is in the individual cups placed at the center of the trays.

For those who wish to receive the sacrament **in the pew** or those who, for health reasons, need **gluten-free** please speak with an Elder, an Usher or Pastor.
